Open Kitchen

"Open Kitchen" is a joint project by Tanpopo-no-ye, a nonprofit organization implementing a wide range of art projects from the standpoint of "art" and "care" in Nara, and Kyoto City University of Arts. Five artists from Tanpopo-no-ye and five students from KCUA paired up and traded artworks over the course of the project. The works were sent in boxes, and the recipients were free to add or make changes to the work, or even to send back an entirely different work. These exchanges began in the summer of 2016 and are still continuing into the present. This exhibition not only shows the works of art that resulted from these exchanges, but also the process itself through video, photographs, and more.
